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## General

- A. Under the Order Concerning Closed Areas (West Bank Area) (Amendment) (No. 34), 1967, the area of Judea and Samaria is a closed military area and not to be entered or exited without a permit issued on behalf of the military commander.
- B. Entry of Gaza Strip residents into Israel is conditional on a permit from the Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) for Gaza, in accordance with qualification under the Entry to Israel order (Exemption of Gaza Strip residents) 5765-2005 as well as the prerogatives of the Area Commander under the Citizenship and Entry into Israel Law (Temporary Order) 5763-2003.
- C. The departure of an Israeli, including an Israeli resident and a foreign national granted a residency permit in Israel, requires a permit issued by the head of the Southern Command and Gaza CLA on the Israeli's behalf, as authorized by article 24 of the Disengagement Plan Implementation Law 5765-2005.
- D. In keeping with the authority assigned to COGAT offices, with the decisions at the political level, and with the security risks arising from actions by terror organizations that exploit the movements of people, there is no separating the implementation, shaping, and definition of policy regarding the movement of people between Israel, Judea and Samaria, and the Gaza Strip on the one hand from the changing political and security situation on the other hand. Accordingly, with respect to the movement of people, the authorized offices frequently review the criteria and revise them according to that situation.
- E. Besides needing to be covered by currently valid authorizations, requests for entry are also evaluated according to the necessary individual security checks that the security services and Israel Police need and according to the political, security, and strategic interests of the State of Israel with respect to the requests. The requests must pass administrative and procedural examinations as required by all the relevant administrative authorities. Also checked is the veracity of the support documents accompanying the request, as is the need for presenting further documents as support.
- F. It bears remembering that a Palestinian resident has no vested right of entry into Israel and an Israeli has no vested right to exit into the Gaza Strip.

- G. Lest any doubt remain, let us clarify that wherever the term “first-degree relative” appears in this document, or in any other documents issued or authorized by COGAT and touching on the movement of people between the State of Israel, the Gaza Strip, and the Judea and Samaria area, it refers exclusively to the mother, father, brothers, sisters, children, and spouse, unless explicitly stated otherwise with reference to a certain individual criterion in a current document. For the exit of Israelis into the Gaza Strip, note that with respect to attending a wedding, funeral, or other exceptional occasions, grandparents are considered first-degree relatives.
- H. Attached to this document, at the end, are "Tables of Permits" that apply to the Palestinian population of Judea, Samaria, and the Gaza Strip. The content of the tables is intended to supplement and complete, where necessary, the criteria listed in the body of the document. Each criterion, as it appears in the body of the document, should be read together with the corresponding line of the tables.
2. **Purpose of the document**
- A. Defining the authorizations for entry of Palestinians into Israel, including entry for the purpose of travel between the Judea and Samaria area and the Gaza Strip and travel for the purpose of going abroad.

## Section A

### Status of authorizations for the Palestinian population in the Judea and Samaria area.

#### 3. Health needs

Entry into Israel is granted on the basis of five primary purposes for the permit:

- A. **Medical needs:** Entry into Israel for patients with a variety of diseases, hospital appointments, and chronic conditions.
- B. **Accompanying a patient:** Entry into Israel in order to accompany a hospitalized family member, a patient in need of assistance, or chronic patients in Israel.
- C. **Visiting the sick:** Entry into Israel in order to visit an ailing Palestinian relative or ailing Israeli relative.
- D. **Physician:** Physicians employed at hospitals in Israel.
- E. **Senior medical staff:** Permits to drive in Israel, for senior medical staff (who are not physicians).

#### 4. Legal needs

Entry into Israel is granted on the basis of 2 primary purposes for the permit:

- A. **An attorney in Israel:** Work of a Palestinian attorney, in Israel, with Palestinian detainees, for the purpose (inter alia) of consultation and preparing for hearings.
- B. **Legal needs:**
  - 1. Participation in court hearings (testifying or being present).
  - 2. Medical examinations required for the purpose of legal proceedings, subject to the existence of either an order instructing that the examination be performed, or alternatively a physician's opinion that the examination is essential to the legal process.

#### 5. Educational needs

Entry into Israel is granted on the basis of six primary purposes for the permit:

- A. **Singular needs of a school employee:** Teachers working in schools of East Jerusalem; other employees of schools in East Jerusalem.
- B. **Singular needs of schoolchildren:** Schoolchildren studying in East Jerusalem.

- C. **Academic studies:** Academic studies in Israel, provided that there is no practical alternative other than Israel. Preference is given to doctoral studies, to masters studies if slots remain, and to study programs that are special in their focus on cooperation, coexistence, and regional peace.
  - D. **Singular needs medical convention:** Participation at a medical conference.
  - E. **Supplementary medical training:** Entry for the purpose of supplementary medical training in Israel.
    - 1) **Permit for supplemental training in hi-tech:** Entry for supplemental training in hi-tech.
6. **Employment (Licenses and permits given by head of the Employment Unit).**
- A. **Employment in Israel:** Entry of Palestinians for work in Israel is granted by issuance of a permit, through head of the Employment Unit for work-related entry into Israel, and it is subject to the criteria and procedures of the Israeli Employment Service, to the employer's possession of an employment permit, to a security evaluation, and to the other defined criteria.
  - B. **Seasonal agriculture:** COGAT is authorized to administer a quota of 10,500 permits for seasonal agriculture. The quotas may be changed in accordance with a request, including the rationale for the change, received from the Ministry of Agriculture and passed to the Civil Department. Each change requires separate approval from head of COGAT.
  - C. **Employment in industrial zones and in Judean and Samarian settlements:** Approved subject to the instructions of the Central Command and on authority of the Civil Administration (head of the Employment Unit): Within the Seam Zone — from age 22 and up, with no quota. In the Judea and Samaria area but outside the Seam Zone — from age 18 and up, with no quota and with no restriction regarding personal status.
  - D. **Laborers for the Hevra Kadisha (burial society):** Exit of Palestinian laborers from Judea and Samaria to work for the Hevra Kadisha in Israel. Entry into Israel is contingent on employment permits. Their entry is approved even during a time of closure (a population exempt from closure). Under authority of the Civil Administration – Employment.
7. **Economy:**
- A. **BMC:** Senior Palestinian businesspeople.

- B. **Assistant to BMC:** May be given, on the occasion of a BMC permit, to three of the BMC's assistants who will be representing the businessperson to Israeli companies.
- C. **Commerce:** Entry of Palestinian merchants into Israel.
- D. **Employee of international organization:** Entry into Israel of Palestinians employed by international organizations.
- E. **Church worker:** Those employed by churches in Israel.
- F. **Religious worker:** Religious workers (priests) in Jerusalem.
- G. **JDECO worker:** Employees of the Jerusalem District Electricity Company (JDECO), supplier of electricity to East Jerusalem.
- H. **Temple Mount employee of the Waqf:** Those who work for the Waqf on the Temple Mount. To the Israel Police on the Temple Mount, the Waqf passes employee lists which are then passed, after examination, to the Jerusalem Envelope DCL.
- I. **Singular needs – Work-related meeting:** Entry of Palestinians for work-related meetings in Israel.
- J. **Singular needs – Jobhunting** Entry of Palestinians into Israel to seek work.
- K. **Tour guide:** Guides for tours in Israel.
- L. **Tourism worker:** Those who work for the tourism sector in Israel.
- M. **Emergency medical team:** Applies to all the hospitals in East Jerusalem and to Red Crescent medical teams.
- N. **Installation procedure:** Those who work in the settlements and are required to leave Judea and Samaria with their employers in order to install the product at the customer's home.
8. **Worship needs**
- Family visits in Israel will be permitted as part of the special civil measures taken during the Muslim holidays: Eid al-Adha (the Festival of the Sacrifice), Ramadan, and the Christian holidays. The measures are announced in special orders.
- Entry of Palestinians into Israel for worship is granted on the basis of five purposes for the permit:
- A. **Christian holiday:** Entry by Christian Palestinians into Israel on Christian holidays.

- B. **Worship on the Temple Mount, Fridays only** Entry of Palestinian worshippers onto the Temple Mount for prayers of Fridays only.
- C. **Family visit:** Visits to relatives in Israel.
- D. **Family visit for holiday:** Approved in the context of special civil measures for the holiday periods (as described above).
- E. **Family visit for Eid al-Adha:** Entry for a visit to relatives during holidays of the Muslim community.

9. **VIP**

Entry of senior figures into Israel is granted on the basis of 2 purposes for the permit:

A. **VIP- 1:**

1. Intended for holders of senior positions in the Palestinian Authority and for others close to the Chairman of the Palestinian Authority (as detailed in the procedure for obtaining VIP status).
2. Authorizes travel (including overnight lodging) between the Judea and Samaria area, the Gaza Strip, and Israel, or between Israel and abroad without a security check (other than at Ben Gurion Airport).
3. Only the Chairman and Prime Minister of the Palestinian Authority may ride across the Allenby Bridge.
4. First-degree relatives who are travelling with a figure of this status are to enjoy a similar status to that figure's for the purpose of the passage (VIP1 status).
5. Figures of this status are entitled to request (by prior coordination) to come to the Allenby Crossing with a vehicle and chauffeur, but the vehicle and chauffeur will not travel abroad.
6. Quota: 120.

B. **VIP- 2:**

1. Intended for those filling various senior positions in the Palestinian Authority (as detailed in the procedure for obtaining VIP status).
2. The holder of the documentation is entitled to a lighter examination while passing through security at the Allenby Bridge, including a luggage screener and magnetometer but no Millimeter Wave Scanner and/or Multi-Mode Threat Detector.
3. Authorized to pass through Israeli crossings at internal crossings (from Judea and Samaria into Israel).



4. Allows for travel from Judea, Samaria, and Gaza to Israel and back (24 hours a day).
5. Figures of this status are entitled to request (by prior coordination) to come to the Allenby Crossing in a bridge taxi (arriving in the taxi at the VIP room of the crossing, or meeting the taxi at the crossing into Judea and Samaria).
6. Quota: 240.

C. **VIP – 3:**

1. Entry into Israel for senior office-holders of the Palestinian Authority, specifically deputy executive directors, mayors, commanders of security apparatuses, heads of Palestinian Coordination Offices, and other senior officials at the Area Commander's discretion.
2. Permit for a one-year term.
3. Entitlement to passage at Ben Gurion Airport (including first-degree relatives at the same time as the senior official).
4. Authority: The Civil Administration
5. Permits for first-degree relatives will be issued for a three-month term.
6. Quota: 360 (10% with vehicle permits).

D. **Further instructions and points of emphasis:**

1. Vehicular passage into Israel will be allowed only for holders of documentation, only with Israeli drivers, and subject to coordination with the crossing's authorities.
2. First-degree relatives of holders of VIP1 documentation are authorized to enter and exit under the no-checking protocol (during times of calm and in the absence of palpable suspicion) at the Allenby Bridge border crossing.
3. All senior figures will undergo a full check at Ben Gurion Airport.

10. **Travel for various needs:**

Entry of Palestinians into Israel is granted for various additional purposes on the basis of 17 purposes for the permit:

- A. **Family reunification:** Family reunification in Israel for Palestinians (as approved by the Ministry of Interior).
- B. **Singular touring needs:** Tours inside Israel for Palestinian groups.
- C. **Singular welfare needs:** To meet welfare-related needs inside Israel.
- D. **Singular wedding needs:** Participation at a wedding in Israel.

- E. **Singular funerary needs:** Participation at a funeral in Israel.
- F. **Singular needs of an embassy interview:** Entry of Palestinians into Israel for interviews at consulates/embassies.
- G. **Veterinarians:** Departure of certified veterinarians from Judea and Samaria into the Gaza Strip for the purpose of helping in specific instances, giving training, and giving professional support.
- H. **Journalists:** Departure of journalists and media personnel into Israel for meetings with the news agencies with which they work.
- I. **Travel abroad:** Departure of Palestinians for abroad through Ben Gurion Airport. (For those with A/5 status in Israel, subject to identification of precluded from leaving for abroad).
- J. **Visiting a prisoner:** Entry of prisoners' families for visits at Israeli prisons, other than visits by families of Hamas prisoners from the Gaza Strip.
- K. **Temporary stays in Judea and Samaria** Renewable permits for presence in Judea and Samaria for 1,100 Palestinians employed by the Palestinian Authority who are registered at Gaza Strip addresses (having left the Gaza Strip in the wake of the June 2007 Hamas takeover) as well as Palestinian residents of the Gaza Strip who are covered by the non-deportation policy declared by the state in HCJ 4019/10 and Palestinians whose entry was authorized under the step-by-step "Procedure for handling applications by Gaza Strip residents for settlement in the Judea and Samaria Area." Renewals are under authority of the Civil Administration. New permits are by COGAT authorization only.
- L. **Personal needs:** Authorization of entry in exceptional cases that do not meet other criteria and fall within unusual circumstances, by discretion regarding the individual case. Authorized under a quota.
- M. **Personal needs – Public sector worker:** For people of the Palestinian Authority ministries, trade unions/federations, the municipal echelons in various areas, and the command echelon outside the Palestinian Coordination Offices and the security apparatuses.
- N. **Personal needs – Financial sector worker:** For those representing parent corporations with a number of subsidiaries (such as Rawabi, PADICO, etc.) or other large companies.

- O. **Singular needs – Lodging in Israel:** For liaison officers, security apparatuses commanders (with rank of Chief Superintendent or higher), and Palestinian employees of the Civil Administration.
  - P. **Singular needs – Israeli organizations:** For Israeli organizations recognized by the Ministry of Justice as nonprofit organizations. The permits will be for the purpose of touring and attending conferences in Israel.
  - Q. **Singular needs – Families of senior Palestinian businesspeople:** Only for first-degree relatives of those who hold BMC documentation.
  - R. **Singular needs – Families of VIPs:** Only for first-degree relatives of those who hold VIP documentation. In accordance with eligibility as detailed in the VIP procedure.
  - S. **Aging Palestinians:** Authorization for entry of aging Palestinians (men over 55, women over 50) with no need for a printed permit.
  - T. **The humanitarian arrangement in Jerusalem:** Residents of Judea and Samaria who live inside the municipal boundaries of Jerusalem and have been recognized by the Ministry of Interior as eligible for permits under the humanitarian arrangement that applies there.
11. **Further instructions and points of emphasis**
- A. **Entry to Eilat:** Entry to the city of Eilat and the Arava area may be authorized for the following people: professionals, to attend conferences being held in the city of Eilat and the Arava area; merchants, for business purposes; tourist agencies with a stake in the city; holders of BMC or VIP documentation; trainees at the Arava Institute; and exceptional humanitarian cases. **Applications are subject to COGAT approval.**
  - B. **Palestinians on their way abroad through the Allenby Bridge:** Authorizations under the following general rules: For residents of Judea and Samaria, departure over the Allenby Bridge toward foreign destinations is approved and requires no prior coordination. Those precluded from leaving for abroad are subject to security approval on a case-by-case basis. Regarding residents of the Gaza Strip who are staying in Judea and Samaria:
    - 1. Those staying on the basis of a renewable permit are authorized to exit with no need for prior coordination.

2. Those staying in Judea and Samaria without a renewable permit require individual coordination with the Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) for Gaza, with evaluation as necessary and in keeping with purposes defined and approved according to the policy for Gaza Strip residents' travel. The request will be evaluated on its merits and the applicant will be informed of the decision.

**C. Requests for permits including lodging in Israel-**

- 1) **The request must include certificates/documents providing verification and support for the approval of a permit that includes lodging. If a request does not provide papers justifying lodging in Israel, it will not be approved.**
- 2) Subject to security evaluation (if a security block has been entered).
- 3) Contingent on possession of a smart card.

## Section B

### Status of authorizations for the Palestinian population in the Gaza Strip

#### 1. General instructions

- A. Requests for the entry of Gaza Strip residents into Israel are passed from the Palestinian Civil Committee — which is responsible to the Palestinian Authority's Ministry of Civil Affairs in Ramallah — to the Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) for Gaza. The Civil Committee is responsible for assembling, screening, and prioritizing the requests directed by Palestinians from the Gaza Strip to the Israeli offices, according to its own discretion. In exceptional cases, requests are accepted that come from sources within the international community or from recognized international organizations.
- B. All the forwarded requests shall receive assessment according to the State of Israel's political, security, and strategic considerations, including individualized security checks regarding the requester or the requester's family, the conformance of the request to the criteria set from time to time for entry of Gaza Strip residents into Israel, necessary administrative checks such as the veracity of the documents attached in support of the requests, the need for additional supporting documents, etc. These checks are an integral part of the assessment and approval process for every request.

#### 2. Health needs

Entry into Israel is granted on the basis of 5 primary purposes for the permit:

- A. **Medical care:** Entry into Israel is approved, even if in order to continue into Judea and Samaria or abroad, for the purpose of receiving life-saving medical care or medical care that is crucial to the quality of life. All this is contingent on the unavailability of the requested treatment in the Gaza Strip.
1. Entry is made possible in accordance with a request from the Palestinian health coordinator, who operates under the aegis of the Palestinian Civil Committee and is responsible for prioritizing the requests, classifying them by urgency, and passing them to the Gaza CLA,

2. It must be emphasized that payment for the medical care is passed from the Palestinian Authority directly to the hospitals in Israel. For that reason, the Palestinian Authority approval is required well in advance for the patient's entry into Israel.
  3. Chronic patients (cancer/dialysis) currently receive permits that can serve as "punch cards" for one day at a time according to the frequency of their treatments (departure for treatment, and return on the same day).
  4. In a case of complicated medical treatment (such as continuous chemotherapy requiring a recovery period), a permit will be approved on an individual basis, after the frequency of treatment is examined along with other factors, covering entry into the Judea and Samaria area or into Israel for a lengthy period (3–6 months), including lodging,
- B. **Accompanying parent:** A parent accompanying a patient who is under the age of 18 and is receiving medical care in Israel, in Judea and Samaria, or abroad. Entry may be approved as specified in the table, for up to one month as appropriate to the frequency of treatment. The permit must be valid, and the patient must have it at hand. If the accompanying parent is not in the patient's presence, the parent may present a valid certificate of hospitalization.
- C. **Other accompanying person:** Someone accompanying a patient who is receiving medical care in Israel, in Judea and Samaria, or abroad. Entry may be approved as specified in the table, for up to one month as appropriate to the frequency of treatment. The permit must be valid, and the patient must have it at hand. If the accompanying parent is not in the patient's presence, the parent may present a valid certificate of hospitalization. As a rule, each patient will have one accompanying person approved. Departure of a minor up to age 18 requires an accompanying person.
- D. **Supplementary medical training:** Entry of medical personnel coming to hospitals or medical centers in Israel or in the Judea and Samaria area for supplemental professional training in medicine and in specialties that can strengthen and improve the medical response provided to residents of the Gaza Strip, with an emphasis on specialties that do not exist in the Gaza Strip.

- E. **Visiting the sick:** Entry of Gaza Strip residents into Israel (including transit into the Judea and Samaria area or abroad) for a visit to a first-degree relative who is under extended hospitalization — including a stay in a recuperation center or at-home hospitalization that involves medical monitoring and attendance — or who is seriously ill and whose life is in danger. (In this context, the patient's age is also taken into consideration.)

3. **Finance and employment**

Entry into Israel is granted on the basis of 4 primary purposes for the permit:

- A. **Merchants:** Travel of Palestinian merchants into Israel, into Judea and Samaria, and abroad. The only requests for entry approved are from senior merchants whose entry stands to contribute to improving the Gaza Strip's economy
- B. **BMC:** Senior Palestinian businesspeople and merchants.
- C. **Person accompanying a BMC:** Entry of the spouse and children of a BMC to accompany the BMC at the crossing.
- D. **Exceptional permit for employment:** Generally, employment of Gaza Strip residents in Israel is not approved. Only an exceptional permit for employment is intended for employees of the Land Crossing Authority in the Ministry of Defense (LCA) whose work is vital to the operation of the land crossings between Israel and the Gaza Strip.

4. **Foreign nationals and international organizations:**

Travel by employees of international organizations is granted on the basis of 3 primary purposes for the permit

- A. **Employees of international organizations:** Palestinians who are employed by international organizations recognized by the Ministry of Welfare, Ministry of Interior, or Foreign Ministry, or employed by diplomatic missions (embassies, consulates, and diplomatic missions to the Palestinian Authority) of countries that maintain diplomatic relations with Israel, and who appear in the list of employees provided by the organizations and missions to the DCL, are permitted to enter Israel but only for purposes of their organization's or mission's activity.

- B. **Beneficiaries of international organizations:** Palestinians who are not employed steadily by an international organization that is recognized by the Ministry of Welfare, Ministry of Interior, or Foreign Ministry, but who are employed temporarily or are participating in projects or programs funded by the organization (such as "contract employees") are permitted to enter Israel but only for purposes of their organization's activity.
- C. **Further instructions — Exit of foreigners from Israel into the Gaza Strip through the Erez Crossing:**

In accordance with the provisions of the "Procedure for coordinating entry into the Gaza Strip by foreign nationals," and subject to the following categorization and instructions:

1. Exit of diplomats into the Gaza Strip:

- A. Departure of diplomats who represent nations that maintain diplomatic relations with Israel, who are accredited to the State of Israel, and who hold official documentation issued on behalf of the Foreign Ministry.
- B. Departure of official representatives of foreign nations that maintain diplomatic relations with the State of Israel, for official purposes on behalf of the nations that they represent, once an official request in their names has been received from their official diplomatic mission in Israel, and provided that the nature of their visit in the Gaza Strip (unlike, for example, a meeting with Hamas figures) does not conflict politically or diplomatically with the interests of the State of Israel .

2. Departure of foreigners who are employees or representatives of recognized international organizations:

- A. Departure of foreigners who are employees of recognized international organizations: For foreigners who are employees of international organizations recognized by the State of Israel through the Ministry of Welfare, Ministry of Interior, or Foreign Ministry, who are foreign citizens, and in whose name an official request has been submitted by the international organization's Israeli headquarters, departure is under the authority of the Commander of the Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) for Gaza.



- i. Departure of foreigners who are representatives of recognized international organizations: Departure of foreigners who not are employees of recognized international organizations, but in whose name an official request has been submitted by the Israeli headquarters of an international organization recognized in Israel, and whose profession requires skills that are vital to the organization's operation (such as physicians, engineers, and special technicians).
3. Exit of foreign journalists into the Gaza Strip: Exit from Israel to the Gaza Strip, and return from there, are granted to those journalists with foreign (non-Israeli) passports only if they possess a certificate and an approval from the Government Press Office (GPO). Subject to individualized evaluation. Under the authority of COGAT.
4. Departure for employees of Christian organizations: Departure is permitted for employees of organizations recognized by the Religious Communities Department of the Ministry of Interior.
5. **Travel for various needs:**

Entry of Gaza Strip residents into Israel, Judea, and Samaria is granted for various additional needs on the basis of 13 purposes:

  - A. **Visiting a prisoner:** Entry of relatives of prisoners, other than Hamas prisoners who are Gaza Strip residents, in order to visit prisoners confined to Israeli prisons, in accordance with the rules and instructions set by the Prisons Authority with respect to visiting prisoners, including the factors of family relationship, quantity of visitors, and frequency of visits.

- B. **Legal needs:** Entry of Gaza Strip residents into Israel for the performance of activities necessary for Israeli court proceedings (for example, testimony at court, examination by a court-appointed medical expert, etc.). Requests will be approved only if they meet the provisions of the "Procedure for evaluating entry requests from Palestinian residents of Gaza for the purpose of legal proceedings in Israel," including the consideration that preventing the resident's entry could be destructive to the legal process or could be seriously harmful to the resident; the existence of exceptional humanitarian considerations having to do with the process and its results; and the absence of any particular block on security or criminal grounds.
- C. **Family reunification:** If Palestinian residents of the Gaza Strip are in the process of "family reunification" in Israel, they may enter Israel and renew their residency, subject to security evaluation on an individual basis from time to time and in keeping with the criteria set by the Ministry of Interior.
- D. **Entry into Israel of minors one of whose parents holds an Israeli ID card will be made possible in the following cases and will be limited in time, without consecutive permits:**
1. In cases when the Palestinian parent is significantly handicapped in functioning (a serious illness, etc.).
  2. In exceptional humanitarian cases when entry into Israel is required under the existing criteria (medical treatment, wedding, funeral, visiting a patient).
  3. When a family reunification process requires reporting to the appropriate Population Authority.
- E. **Interview at an embassy:** Entry of Gaza Strip residents into Israel for an interview at a consulate/embassy, provided that no such interview is available in the Gaza Strip. Gaza Strip residents will be allowed to travel to the American consulate in Jerusalem on dates coordinated in advance with the American consulate.
- F. **Journalists:** Departure of journalists and media personnel into Israel for meetings with the news agencies with which they work.
- G. **Departure abroad:** Gaza Strip residents may enter through the Allenby Crossing in order to depart abroad for the following purposes:

4. Medical treatment: Medical care that is life-saving or is crucial to the quality of life. In addition, departure will be made possible for the sake of exceptional treatments, at the discretion of the DCL and depending on the treatments' availability in the Gaza Strip.
5. Conference: A unique conference in the sphere of medicine, agriculture, energy, water, waste, hi-tech, or finance, for the sake of advancing projects.
6. Study: Departure of students for academic study abroad (all degrees) and for certificate studies (practical engineers and technicians).
7.  Holders of scholarships: Gaza Strip residents with scholarships recognized by a state that maintains diplomatic relations with the State of Israel, or by an international organization recognized by the State of Israel (the Welfare Ministry, Ministry of Interior, or Foreign Ministry), may enter in order to depart – by way of Israel, Judea and Samaria, and the Allenby Crossing into Jordan — for academic studies abroad. Their departure with spouses and children, but with no others, may be granted upon request. The above is contingent on receiving word directly from the country where the scholarship student is intended to study, or by way of a recognized international organization, and contingent on accompaniment on behalf of the diplomatic mission or international organization.
8. Long-term stays abroad: As a rule, any Gaza Strip resident's request to enter Israel and the Judea and Samaria area in order to depart abroad for any of various personal reasons, with a written commitment not to return through Israel and the Judea and Samaria area into the Gaza Strip during at least the next half year, will be granted, subject to individualized security evaluation and to signing a statement of commitment not to return to the Gaza Strip through Israel and the Judea and Samaria area during at least the next half year.
9. Supplemental training: For teachers and academics (lecturers).
10. Request from a foreign consulate/embassy in Israel: If an official request is received from a foreign consulate and/or embassy in Israel, it must be presented in an official letter on their behalf that includes a photo of a valid passport and the rest of the details required as above. Travel through Israel / the Judea and Samaria area, until the departure abroad, must be with an escort from the appropriate consulate.

**11. Departure abroad by Palestinian residents shall be through the Allenby Crossing, solely in escorted groups (shuttles).** Exceptions are by approval of the COGAT Operations Department. As a rule, Palestinians are not granted departure through Ben Gurion Airport, with the exception of BMC permit holders and extremely exceptional unique humanitarian cases (monthly quota of 20). Following an approved departure through Ben Gurion Airport, the same resident may also return through Ben Gurion Airport.

- H. **Attending a funeral or wedding:** Entry of Gaza Strip residents into Israel (even in transit to the Judea and Samaria area or abroad) in order to attend a wedding or funeral of a first-degree relative. Entry of accompanying children: The minor children (up to 15 years old) of a Gaza Strip resident who has been granted entry into Israel in order to visit a seriously ailing first-degree relative (clause 2.a.5 above), to attend a funeral or wedding (clause 4.a.1), or for some other humanitarian need, at the discretion of the authorized offices.
- I. **Prayer on the Temple Mount:** Entry of Gaza Strip residents for prayer each Friday on the Temple Mount. Under a quota, restricted by age, and organized exceptionally on the basis of buses rented by the Palestinian Authority, with a representative of the Palestinian Authority as escort. **Entry for this purpose is halted until further notice.**
- J. **Touring:**
1. Entry of Palestinian pupils residing in the Gaza Strip (up to 15 years old) for tours in Israel or the Judea and Samaria area on weekdays, including teachers as escorts, with one teacher per 15 pupils.
  2. An organized tour for children who are ailing or have special needs – Entry of children who are ailing and who have special needs, for organized tours of a unique and humanitarian nature in Israel or in the Judea and Samaria area. Entry of children with special needs requires the sponsorship of an Israeli NGO.
- K. **Personal needs:** Authorization of entry in exceptional cases that do not meet other criteria and fall within unusual circumstances, by discretion regarding the individual case. Authorized under a quota.

L. **Attending a conference:** Entry of Palestinian professionals in the spheres of agriculture, medicine, water, waste, energy, hi-tech, and finance, to attend conferences held in those spheres in the Judea and Samaria area and in Israel. In addition, entry of Gaza Strip residents for conferences and special events of the Palestinian Authority in Judea and Samaria, subject to receipt of a detailed request from Palestinian Authority representatives.

M. **Work-related meetings:**

1. Entry into Israel or the Judea and Samaria area for senior figures in the area of energy, water, communications, waste, health, or environmental quality, for the purpose of advancing projects in those fields and for work-related meetings at companies and at government offices.
2. In addition, entry into Israel or the Judea and Samaria area for senior figures in the economic sector who are not merchants, or in the areas of banking, tourism, insurance, communications, and hi-tech, for the purpose of work-related meetings in those fields.
3. Senior Fatah figures, for meetings in Ramallah.
4. Employees of the Palestinian Authority, for meetings at the Palestinian Authority offices in Ramallah.
5. Entry of sportspeople: All Gaza Strip residents who are members of the national and local sports teams may enter Israel in transit to the Judea and Samaria area or abroad for official activities of the teams. In addition, such entry is permitted for members of the Palestinian Olympic Committee and Palestinian Football Association. Under the authority of COGAT. Requires approval from the head of the Operations Department and coordination with COGAT.
6. Entry for conferences and events of the Palestinian Authority: From time to time, contingent on receipt of a detailed request from Palestinian Authority representatives in the Judea and Samaria area, residents of the Gaza Strip may enter the Judea and Samaria area in order to attend conferences or special events sponsored by the Palestinian Authority. Under the authority of COGAT. Requires approval from the head of the Operations Department and coordination with COGAT.

6. **Senior Palestinian figures**

- A. Holders of VIP1 and VIP2 documents, senior Palestinian figures who fill key positions in the Palestinian Authority and appear in lists provided by the Palestinian Authority's Ministry of Civil Affairs, subject to approval from COGAT.
  - B. For the new ministers who are Gaza Strip residents, requests to approve travel into the Judea and Samaria area / abroad will be handled by the Operations Branch of COGAT.
  - C. For Gaza Strip residents who are members of Fatah or are members (regardless of organizational affiliation) of the Palestinian Legislative Council, requests for entry into Israel and into the Judea and Samaria area will be handled by the Operations Branch of COGAT.
  - D. For members of the Electoral Commission from the Gaza Strip and the Judea and Samaria area, travel requests will be handled by the Operations Branch of COGAT.
7. **Exit of Israelis into the Gaza Strip:**
- A. Under authority of the head of the Southern Command, and the Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) for Gaza on that officer's behalf, subject to approval by the appropriate offices at the Ministry of Interior and to the necessary security checks.
  - B. Currently, in order to temporarily reduce the entry of Israelis into the Gaza Strip in accordance with a directive from the head of the Southern Command, exit of Israelis will not be approved except in humanitarian cases that have been examined in detail and in exceptional, unique, and urgent circumstances only.
  - C. Accordingly, the criteria for the exit of Israelis into the Gaza Strip are listed here:
    - 1. **Departure in a case of exceptional humanitarian need:**
      - A. Exit of Israelis into the Gaza Strip in order to visit a first-degree relative / grandparent with a serious illness that endangers life or requires lengthy hospitalization.
      - B. Exit of Israelis into the Gaza Strip in order to attend a funeral or wedding of first-degree relative, including grandparents.
      - C. **Exit of accompanying children:** Israelis permitted to exit into the Gaza Strip according to the above criteria may be accompanied by their children who are up to 16 years old and no older.

2. "Separated families": Departure of Israelis whose spouses reside in the Gaza Strip ("separated families") for the purpose of union with their spouses and together with their Israeli children up to age 18. If an Israeli parent is unable to exit to the Gaza Strip (but only in cases of serious illness that prevent travel, of death, or of divorce), that parent's children will be allowed to exit into the Gaza Strip for a visit to the Gazan parent.
  - A. Children up to 16 years old may be accompanied by one first-degree or second-degree relative (an elder brother up to 18 years old, a grandparent, or in exceptional cases an Israeli uncle or aunt).
  - B. The approval will be given only to the Israeli relatives (parents/children).
  - C. Departure of children (up to age 18) will be preceded by the Israeli guardian's signature on a declaration waiving personal and security responsibility before the departure into the Gaza Strip.
  - D. Without being accompanied by a parent, children may depart for a period of no more than one week.
3. Israelis who reside in East Jerusalem and are employed by international organizations: Departure, from East Jerusalem to the Gaza Strip, of Israelis employed by international organizations that are recognized by the Israeli Ministry of Welfare, Ministry of Interior, or Foreign Ministry, or of employees of diplomatic missions of states that maintain diplomatic relations with the State of Israel, whose expertise or specialty is vital to the functioning of the organization or diplomatic mission in the Gaza Strip.
4. Businesspeople and others, but only residents of East Jerusalem: Those aiming to improve and advance the Gaza Strip's economy and humanitarian infrastructure. A quota limits this category to 150 East Jerusalemites at any given time, subject to criteria as stipulated in the procedure.

5. Departure of up to 500 Arab Israeli merchants aiming to improve and advance the Gaza Strip's economy, in accordance with the criteria: Approval for the exit of Israelis into the Gaza Strip depends not only on the above criteria but also on the results of all the necessary security checks, on the changing political/security situation and its possible implications at the Erez Crossing, and on the anticipated risks connected with the travel of Israelis into the Gaza Strip. In addition, permission to exit into the Gaza Strip is conditioned on fulfillment of all the requirements and conditions defined by all the public authorities operating at the Erez Crossing, in accordance with the jurisdiction and rules of each.



## Section C

### Status of authorizations for entry of Palestinians into Israel for transit between the Judea and Samaria area and the Gaza Strip

1. Judea and Samaria area residents may depart in only the following exceptional cases:

- A. Entry of Judea and Samaria area residents into the Gaza Strip is approved under the most limited scope, with the emphasis on humanitarian cases only, **subject to a request on behalf of the the Palestinian Authority's coordination and liaison offices, the recommendation of the legal advisor for Judea and Samaria as necessary, a security evaluation, and the stand taken by the Gaza CLA. COGAT has authority over exceptions.**
- B. As a rule, the requests evaluated will have been submitted for the following purposes:
1. **Departure in order to visit a seriously ailing relative** – Departure of Judea and Samaria area residents into the Gaza Strip to visit a first-degree relative who has a serious illness that is life-threatening or requires lengthy hospitalization.
  2. **Departure in order to attend a funeral or wedding:** Departure of Judea and Samaria area residents into the Gaza Strip to attend the wedding or funeral of a first-degree relative.
  3. **Departure in order to take up residence in the Gaza Strip** and to transfer the resident's center of living to the Gaza Strip. In accordance with the provisions of the "Procedure for settlement in the Gaza Strip by Judea and Samaria area residents."
  4. **Entry from Judea and Samaria into Israel of Palestinians whose registered residence is in the Gaza Strip, in order to return to the Gaza Strip:** Under the authority of the following DCLs: Jericho, Jerusalem Envelope, Hebron (Representative Office in Tarqumiya), and of the liaison office at the Allenby Bridge with respect to the issuance of return permits into the Gaza Strip for Gaza Strip residents who have been staying in the Judea and Samaria area for up to a year since the day of their departure from the Gaza Strip. The granting of a permit is subject to the hours of operation at the crossings. Regarding Gaza Strip residents who have been staying for more than a year in the Judea and Samaria area, the above DCLs should request approval from the Gaza CLA..

5. **Departure of senior Palestinian officials into the Gaza Strip:** Departure of Palestinians who fill key positions in the Palestinian Authority and who appear in the list provided by the PA Chairman's office to COGAT.
6. **Departure of Palestinian employees of international organizations who reside in Judea and Samaria into the Gaza Strip:** Departure into the Gaza Strip of Palestinian residents of Judea and Samaria who work for international organizations recognized by the State of Israel (by the Welfare Ministry, Foreign Ministry, or Ministry of Interior) or employees of the diplomatic missions of countries that maintain diplomatic relations with the State of Israel, whose expertise or specialty is vital to the operations of the organization or mission in the Gaza Strip. A long-term stay in the Gaza Strip (more than a week) requires receipt of approval from the Operations Department Head and coordination with COGAT.

2. **Entry of Gaza Strip residents into the Judea and Samaria area**

- A. **For medical treatment** that is life-saving or is crucial to the quality of life. As detailed in Section B (Clause 2.a.1) of this document. Under the authority of the Commander of the Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) for Gaza.
- B. **Visiting a first-degree relative who is seriously ailing**, as detailed in Section B (Clause 2.a.3) of this document. Under the authority of the Commander of the Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) for Gaza.
- C. **Attending the funeral or wedding of a first-degree relative**, as detailed in Section B (Clause 4.a.1) of this document. Under the authority of the Commander of the Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) for Gaza.
- D. **Departure of Gaza Strip residents to Jordan across the Allenby Bridge** – approved in exceptional humanitarian cases, according to criteria of the travel policy and subject to security evaluation after coordination between the Gaza CLA and the Civil Administration in Judea and Samaria / Allenby Bridge liaison office.
- E. Gaza Strip residents who have lived for more than a year in the Judea and Samaria area, and/or hold a renewable permit for residency, shall be approved by the Civil Administration for departure from the area into Jordan across the Allenby Bridge, subject to the directives from the security evaluation.

- F. **Sportspeople** — As detailed in Section B (Clause 4.b) of this document. Under the authority of COGAT. Requires approval from the head of the Operations Department and coordination with COGAT.
- G. **Entry for conferences and events of the Palestinian Authority** — As detailed in Section B (Clause 4.c) of this document. Under the authority of COGAT. Requires approval from the head of the Operations Department and coordination with COGAT.
- H. **Entry from the Gaza Strip into the Judea and Samaria area for Palestinian employees of recognized international organizations** — As detailed in Section B (Clause 6.a.1) of this document.
- I. **Entry into Israel from the Gaza Strip, by Palestinians with a registered address in the Judea and Samaria area, for the purpose of returning to the Judea and Samaria area**— At a place where their transit to the Gaza Strip is carried out at the discretion of the State of Israel and in coordination with it, if no restriction applies to their return through Israel to the area.
- J. **Entry of Gaza Strip residents for conferences/training in Judea, Samaria, and Israel in connection with rehabilitation of the Gaza Strip**— Gaza Strip residents may enter in order to attend professional conferences/training in Judea, Samaria, and Israel on behalf of the Palestinian Authority for the sake of the Gaza Strip's rehabilitation (in the fields of infrastructure and economics). Subject to security evaluation and presentation of a request from the Palestinian Authority.
- K. **Arrival to the Gaza Strip — Rehabilitation:** Officials in roles connected with the rehabilitation of the Gaza Strip (only officials of the Palestinian Authority and other figures directly connected with the rehabilitation work being carried out in coordination with the State of Israel) may pass from Judea and Samaria to the Gaza Strip and vice versa. This criterion does not include transit for merchants. Permission for these officials to pass from Judea and Samaria to the Gaza Strip is under the authority of the Civil Administration in coordination with the Gaza CLA. Permits will be issued to those officials with the Gaza Strip as destination and "Arrival to the Gaza Strip – Rehabilitation" as purpose.

- L. In addition, Israeli Arabs may enter the Gaza Strip for the purpose of its rehabilitation. This applies to the economic sector — merchants, including Arabs of East Jerusalem. Quota — Up to 500 merchants at any given time. Term of the permit — Up to one month. Subject to evaluation.
  - M. The Gaza CLA has authority to authorize entry into Judea and Samaria of Palestinian Authority officials, including only those filling professional positions in services such as the water authority and electricity authority who are directly connected with the rehabilitation of the Gaza Strip.
3. **Directives applying to transit both from the Judea and Samaria area to the Gaza Strip and vice versa:**
- A. Residents requesting to return to their place of residence shall be handled according to place of residence and not according to their location at the time of the request.
  - B. A resident who has executed a change of address / A resident who has been in the other area for more than a year shall be handled by the area where the resident is located at the time of the request and not according to the place of residence (primarily because of security evaluation considerations).
  - C. Entry of accompanying children: Minor children (up to age 16) may cross together with a parent residing in the Gaza Strip who has been approved for entry into Judea and Samaria or a parent residing in Judea and Samaria area who has been approved for exit into the Gaza Strip via Israel when the purpose is to visit a first-degree family member who is seriously ailing or to attend the wedding or funeral of a first-degree relative, at the discretion of the DCL. ("First-degree relative" = Parent/sibling/child of the visited resident, as well as grandparent of the visited resident).
